Medical Waiver, Liability Release and Program Rules Acknowledgment

The program Medical Waiver, Liability Release and Program Rules must be printed and signed by the parent or legal guardian and presented to the designated program staff on registration day. A signed Medical Waiver, Liability Release and Program Rules is mandatory for participation in the summer program.

Blueprint Admissions

Program Rules

Blueprint's Program Rules are designed to produce a supportive, welcoming environment for each student. And each summer community is founded on the principles of honesty, compassion, respect for others, personal responsibility and safety. Students and staff alike are encouraged to lead by example and place the needs of others above their own self-interests. Although violation of program rules will result in disciplinary action and even expulsion, Blueprint treats each incident objectively, and with the singular goal of improving student safety.

Primary Rules

Community Living

Students are expected to treat others with respect and should refrain from rumor mongering, the use of improper language, insults and insensitive comments. Physical abuse, intimidation, or other acts of aggressive behavior will not be tolerated. Students must respect the rights of others to live in a community free of personal harassment and/or discrimination.

Honesty & Respect

Honesty in action and respect for others is expected of every student at all times.

Student Supervision

Students are required to be within eyesight or earshot of program staff at all times, including all off-campus activities. Students are not allowed outside the residence hall after curfew unless escorted by program staff.

Personal Property

Prior to the program, students should label important personal belongings and the loss and/or damage of personal property is solely the responsibility of each student. Students should lock their rooms and immediately report any lost items to the program director. Students may request to store valuable items in the program office. Unclaimed personal property will be returned to Blueprint Admissions.

Drugs & Alcohol

The use of illegal or controlled substances, including alcoholic beverages and tobacco is strictly prohibited. Student medications and OTC drugs will be dispensed through designated program staff.

Fire Safety

Open flames, including candles and incense burners are not allowed on campus. Additionally, tampering with fire alarms or fire extinguishers is strictly prohibited.

Campus Life

Student Meal Plans

Each program offers three full meals a day and students are required to follow all college-specific dining guidelines, including but not limited to designated dining areas and meal times. Students are not to take trays, dishes, or silverware out of the dining hall and must follow all rules relating to dining hall cleanup.

Roommate Guidelines

When possible, students are assigned roommates according to grade and course. Students are expected to address roommate issues in a civil manner, and with respect and compassion. Resident Advisors are present on each hall, and specially trained to help students work through all roommate related issues in a constructive and supportive manner. Students requesting a roommate change are required to speak with the program director. Roommate changes, although possible, are generally discouraged and each request is taken on a case-by-case basis.

Residence Check

Residence check is at 11:00 pm and students are expected to be in their rooms at that time, unless otherwise indicated. Students are expected to be respectful of their neighbors, and refrain from making loud noises after 11:00 pm. Students are not required to turn off lights at a predetermined time. However, each day is filled with activities that are best enjoyed when well rested.

Dress Code

The program maintains no formal dress code; however students are asked to adhere to a set of basic guidelines regarding student attire. Shoes and shirts are required at all times, with the exception of sports related activities. Clothing should be in good condition and free of offensive language or images. Inappropriately short skirts and shorts are not allowed. Students in violation of these guidelines are prohibited from participating in program activities until the required wardrobe change is made.

Student Rooms

Students are asked to keep their rooms safe and clean. And program staff may inspect student rooms for required maintenance, to assess student safety or enforce program rules. Advance notice will be provided when possible, and staff or school personnel will identify themselves in the event of inspection or required maintenance.

Program, School and Personal Property

Unauthorized taking, use or destruction of program, school or personal property is prohibited.

Property Damage

Students are responsible for preserving the integrity of school property and charges for damaged property will be assessed against any and all individuals deemed responsible for any damage. This rule includes all property under the direct use of each student, including but not limited to student rooms, furniture, common areas, classrooms, and school technology. Charges associated with student room damage will be allocated among all roommates, in the event that an individual resident cannot be identified.

School Technology & Online Safety

The use of school technology and the Internet must comply with existing intellectual property laws and program rules. Downloading or viewing pornographic material is strictly prohibited, and user names, passwords, and sensitive technology settings should not be tampered with under any circumstances. Unless granted explicit permission by program staff, students should refrain from downloading additional programs and deleting, renaming or moving files when using school technology.

Mobile Phone Usage

While on campus, mobile phones should be used in student rooms only. Exceptions to this rule include contacting program staff, the program office or reporting an emergency. During off-campus activities, students may use their mobile phones to contact or assist program staff. Students found in violation of this rule will receive an initial warning. Additional violations can result in the phone being taken away for the duration of the program.

Restaurant Food Delivery

Students must notify program staff of all food deliveries. Deliveries should be made prior to Check-In and must take place at the previously designated residence hall entrance. A staff member should be present for any food delivery.

Student Visitation Guidelines

Overnight guests are not allowed; however, students may submit a written request to invite guests to the program during the day. Requests must be submitted to the program director and are contingent upon individual program rules. Requests must be submitted 24 hours in advance and all guests are required to sign Blueprint's liability and medical release documents.

Laundry

Coin operated laundry machines are available for student use in the residence halls.

Weapons

Weapons of any kind are strictly prohibited.

Sexual Behavior

Students are prohibited from engaging in sexual behavior.

Fire Safety

In the event of a fire alarm, students must follow previously established evacuation procedures and are required to follow all fire safety protocols. Failure to evacuate school facilities in the event of a fire alarm may result in dismissal from the program.

Classroom Conduct

Class Schedules & Conduct

Each program maintains its own unique class schedule, and students are required to attend all classes. Students should be prompt, seated and prepared for class activities according to each period's start time. During class time, students should refrain from interrupting others and, unless otherwise indicated, raise their hands for permission to address their classmates. Students are responsible for maintaining a clean learning environment and dispensing of their own trash.

Student Work

There is no homework or testing. Students are asked to participate in class activities and be honest in their work.

Food and Beverages

With the exception of bottled water, food and beverages are not allowed in the classroom.

Personal Technology

Cell phones, and other personal electronics must be turned off or set to silent during all class time.

Student Health

Program Health Center

Students that are sick should contact the Program Director, and immediately proceed to the Health Center located in the Residence Hall. In the case of a

medical emergency, emergency medical services will be contacted followed by the student's parents. Each program maintains a designated regional hospital and on-call physician to assess student medical issues. Additionally, all program staff are certified in First Aid.

Student Medical History and Physical Examination Forms

The Medical History and Physical Examination Form is required for attendance and must be completed and returned no later than June 15th, 2010. The Medical History portion of the form should be completed and signed by a Parent or Legal Guardian prior to the student's physical. The Physical Examination portion must be completed and signed by a qualified, licensed physician.

A report of a physical examination conducted within 12 months of the program's end date can be submitted in lieu of the physical examination form. However, families choosing to submit substitute forms are required to complete a Medical History and provide immunization records.

Health Insurance

All students are required to have health insurance. Health insurance policy information must be provided in the student's Medical History and Physical Examination Forms. Costs associated with all medical services are the sole responsibility of the student's family, including services rendered by providers outside the student's health insurance policy.

Student Medications

Designated program staff will dispense all over-the-counter drugs and prescription medications. Medications are distributed according to physician's orders stated in the student's Medical History and Physical Evaluation Form. Students should provide designated program staff with all student medications on registration day. A registered pharmacist must label all prescription medications. Over-the-counter drugs and prescription medications are dispensed in the Health Center.

Students are prohibited from carrying or dispensing any over-the-counter drugs and prescription medications without explicit authorization from the program director and/or the student's primary care physician. Controlled substances, including but not limited to antidepressants and stimulants, will be dispensed in the Health Center.

Take I-20 E. towards Florence. Get off on Hwy. 15 N. (Exit 116) to Bishopville. Follow Hwy. 15 to Hartsville. You will enter Hartsville on 5th Street. Take a right at the 5th traffic light onto College Avenue. Follow College Avenue straight onto campus. (Approximately 1 to 1 1/2 hours)

FROM CHARLOTTE

Take I-77 S. to I-485 S. to Pineville. Take Exit 61 (Johnston Road) to Hwy. 521 S. to Lancaster. Take Hwy. 521 by-pass around Lancaster and exit onto Hwy. 903 (signs for McBee, Myrtle Beach). Hwy. 903 runs into Hwy. 151, bear right and follow Hwy. 151 to Hartsville. Turn left onto Hwy. 151 Business at Hartsville. It becomes Carolina Avenue. Turn left onto 4th Street. Take the first right onto College Avenue. Follow College Avenue to campus gates. (Approximately 1 1/2 - 2 hours)

FROM THE SOUTHEAST (INDIANAPOLIS-SOUTH AND WEST SIDE)

Take I-74 to exit 39 (Indiana 32), go left off the interstate into downtown Crawfordsville (approximately four miles). Turn left (south) on U.S. 231 (Washington Street) and continue three blocks to Wabash Avenue. Turn right on Wabash Avenue and continue three blocks to campus. The main entrance to the campus will be on your left.

FROM THE NORTHEAST (INDIANAPOLIS-NORTH AND EAST SIDE)

Take I-465 North to the I-65/465 split. Follow the signs for Chicago. Continue on I-65 for approximately 11 miles to the Crawfordsville exit (Indiana 32). Go left off the interstate and continue on Indiana 32 for 22 miles into downtown Crawfordsville. Turn left (south) on U.S. 231 (Washington Street) and continue three blocks to Wabash Avenue. Turn right on Wabash Avenue and continue three blocks to campus. The main entrance to campus will be on your left.

FROM THE WEST (ILLINOIS)

Take I-74 to exit 34 (U.S. 231), turn right (south) off the interstate into downtown Crawfordsville (five miles). Proceed south to Wabash Avenue (you will see a sign for Wabash on the right). Turn right onto Wabash Avenue and continue three blocks to campus. The main entrance to campus will be on your left.

FROM THE NORTH (I-65, LAFAYETTE)

Take U.S. 231 South into downtown Crawfordsville (approximately 30 miles). Proceed south to Wabash Avenue (you will see a sign for Wabash on the right). Turn right onto Wabash Avenue and continue three blocks to campus. The main entrance to campus will be on your left.

FROM THE SOUTH (I-70, GREENCASTLE)

Take U.S. 231 into downtown Crawfordsville. Proceed north on U.S. 231 (Washington Street) to Wabash Avenue. Turn left onto Wabash Avenue and continue three blocks to campus. The main entrance to campus will be on your left.
